



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHERE CAN WE EAT OUR LUNCH?

If the weather is nice, groups may eat bag lunches in the BMA's Sculpture Gardens. The BMA has no vending machines or cafeteria with fast food. No drinks, food, or gum are permitted in the Museum galleries.

If you would like to eat in the Garden, you must make arrangements with the Tour Coordinator when you book your tour. Please respect the following guidelines in the Sculpture Garden:

- Food must not be opened or eaten on or near the sculptures.
- Students must not touch, sit, climb on, or put their feet on any part of the sculpture, including its base.
- All trash must be placed in the receptacles and the area must be left clean.

WHERE DO WE PUT COATS, LARGE BAGS, BACKPACKS, AND BAG LUNCHES?

The BMA requests that visitors not bring backpacks or other large bags to the Museum.

- School groups entering the School Tour Entrance will place coats, backpacks, and bag lunches in special bins before entering the galleries.
- Groups or individuals entering the Visitor Entrance will be asked to place all backpacks, large bags, baby backpack carriers, and umbrellas at the free Coat Check near the Visitor Entrance. This includes purses, bags, or diaper bags 11 x 14 inches or larger.

MAY WE TAKE PHOTOGRAPHS?

Photography for personal use is welcome in collection galleries—without flash, lights, or a tripod. Please use existing light. Art in temporary exhibitions and on loan may not be photographed (advance permission is needed from lenders). Videotaping is not permitted in the galleries. Photographs may not be reproduced, distributed, or sold without permission from the BMA.

HOW DO WE GET TO THE BMA?

From the north:

- I-95 to I-695 to I-83 South to 28th Street exit
- From 28th Street, turn left onto Howard Street
- Pass 29th Street, bear right at fork onto Art Museum Drive

From the south:

- I-95 to I-395 to Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard
- From MLK Boulevard, turn left onto Howard Street
- Continue north past 29th Street
- Bear right at fork onto Art Museum Drive

IS PARKING AVAILABLE?

- If space is available, buses may park along Art Museum Drive.
- Cars may park at E-Z Park metered parking areas along Art Museum Drive or in the two gated premium parking lots near the Visitor Entrance and the Contemporary Wing.
